As required in Act 1202 of 2013, Section 38(a)-(e), the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality presents the following information:

- (a) the number and type of environmental permits currently authorized by the Department and Pollution Control and Ecology Commission in each environmental permit category,
- (b) the total funds collected from permit fees for each permit category and the percent increase or decrease in permit fees annually,
- (c) the description of each environmental permit application pending in each environmental permit category, the number of days each permit has been pending, and the reasons for delays in issuing permits for each permit that has been pending for more than 45 days,
- (d) the number and type of enforcement actions initiated by the Department, the geographic location of each violation and the total fines and collections from Supplemental Environmental Projects, the percent increase or decrease in fines levied annually, and
- (e) the description of all pending rulemaking activities and justifications, including economic impact and environmental benefit analysis.

#### ON RULEMAKING ACTIVITIES

Months In Quarter: April, May, and June 2014

- 1. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 2, Third-Party Rulemaking, River Valley Regional Water District; Docket No. 06-003-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: River Valley Regional Water District ("RVRWD").
- b. Description: RVRWD filed its request to initiate rulemaking on January 13, 2006. These amendments concern Regulation No. 2. Proposed changes involve amending Regulation No. 2 to include amending Section 2.304 to establish a procedure by which regional water districts and other public water authorities would be able to request approval from the Pollution Control & Ecology Commission to use a water body designated as extraordinary resource waters as a source of drinking water supply.

The Commission initiated the rulemaking process on January 27, 2006, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: These amendments establish a procedure by which regional water distribution districts and other public water authorities would be able to request approval from the Arkansas Pollution Control & Ecology Commission to use Extraordinary Resource Waters as a source of drinking water supply.
- **d. Economic Impact:** RVRWD states that there will be no cost to the agency. The amendments will have no financial impact on small business.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No environmental benefit analysis is required for this regulation.

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- 2. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 18, Arkansas Air Pollution Control Code; Docket No. 12-009-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.
- b. Description: ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on September 14, 2012. ADEQ proposes revisions to Regulation No. 18 in order to implement the United States Environmental Protection Agency's current National Ambient Air Quality Standards ("NAAQS") for PM2.5, PM10, ozone, lead, carbon monoxide, nitrogen dioxide, and sulfur dioxide.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on September 28, 2012, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: This proposed rule is necessary to ensure that the Arkansas regulation is not in conflict with federal rules that have been adopted. Also, by revising Regulation No. 18, ADEQ will be able to issue permits for fine particulate matter. Because the National Ambient Air Quality Standard for particulate matter is a health-based standard, this rule change will allow ADEQ to protect human health and the environment from detrimental effects of fine particulate matter.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- 3. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 19, Regulation of the Arkansas Plan of Implementation for Air Pollution Control; Docket No. 12-010-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.
- **b. Description:** ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on September 14, 2012. ADEQ is proposing revisions to

Regulation No. 19 in order to implement the Environmental Protection Agency's National Ambient Air Quality Standards ("NAAQS") for PM2.5, PM10, ozone, lead, nitrogen dioxide, and sulfur dioxide. Other proposed changes include revising the definition of "Volatile Organic Compounds" under Chapter 2, including exemptions for propylene carbonate, dimethyl carbonate, and trans-1,3,3,3-tetrafluoropropne (HFO-1234ze) to more closely match the federal definition; removing the reference to 40 C.F.R. Part 50 under Reg.19.301; and revising the definition of "Regulated NSR Pollutant" under Reg.19.903(B), as opposed to incorporating it by reference.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on September 28, 2012, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: This proposed rule is necessary to bring Arkansas into compliance with federal rule changes made as the NAAQS have been revised by the EPA. The goal is for sources to find it less difficult to understand permitting requirements. Because the primary NAAQS are health-based standards and secondary NAAQS standards are set to protect public welfare, this rule change will allow ADEQ to protect human health and the environment from detrimental effects caused by NAAQS pollutants. The rule will also satisfy the State's requirements under the Clean Air Act to prevent significant deterioration of air quality in areas of the state designated as "attainment" or "unclassifiable" for each NAAQS.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- **4. Regulation Number and Name:** Regulation No. 26, Regulations of the Arkansas Operating Air Permit Program; Docket No. 12-011-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of
  Environmental Quality.

**b. Description:** ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on September 14, 2012. ADEQ proposes to modify this regulation by adding "10 tons per year of PM2.5", a minor permit modification threshold for fine particulate matter (PM2.5), under Reg.26.1002(A).

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on September 28, 2012, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: Making the proposed amendments will establish a minor permit modification threshold for fine particulate matter (PM2.5) in Regulation No. 26; will lower the potential cost impacts for those facilities increasing PM2.5 emission by small amounts; and will allow changes to a facility to be implemented more quickly. All other changes to Regulation No. 26 were made as updates, for clarification, and to correct errors.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- 5. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 2, Lion Oil Company Third-Party Rulemaking; Docket No. 13-001-R.
  - a. Amendment Proposed By: Lion Oil Company.
- b. Description: Lion Oil Company ("Lion Oil") filed its request to initiate rulemaking on January 11, 2013. Lion Oil proposes to change the Typical Gulf Coastal Fishery use designation for Loutre Creek; change the selenium water quality criterion for Loutre Creek; change the chloride, sulfate and total dissolved solids ("TDS") criteria for Loutre Creek; change the sulfate and TDS criteria for the next downstream segment of Bayou de Loutre; and change the sulfate criteria for the remaining downstream segments of Bayou de Loutre to the Louisiana State line.

The Commission is waiting on a request by Lion Oil to initiate rulemaking.

- c. Justification: These regulatory changes are critically important to Lion Oil. Reasonably available control technology does not exist that would allow Lion Oil to consistently meet these limits. The proposed rule will revise the dissolved minerals and selenium water quality criteria in Loutre Creek and change the fishery use designation for Loutre Creek to a new sub-category of fishery referred to as a Limited Gulf Coastal Fishery. The proposed rule will also revise the chloride, sulfate, and the TDS criteria for one downstream segment in Bayou de Loutre; the sulfate and TDS criteria for the next downstream segment in Bayou de Loutre; and the sulfate criteria for the remaining downstream segments of Bayou de Loutre to the Louisiana State line.
- d. Economic Impact: No entities would suffer negative economic impact as a result of the proposed rule.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: The proposed rule will revise the chloride, sulfate, TDS, and selenium water quality criteria in Loutre Creek, and change the fishery use designation for Loutre Creek to a new subcategory of fishery referred to as a Limited Gulf Coastal Fishery reflecting the long term historical in-stream concentrations and uses. The proposed rule will also revise the chloride, sulfate, and TDS criteria for one downstream segment in Bayou de Loutre; the sulfate and TDS criteria for the next downstream segment in Bayou de Loutre; and the sulfate criteria for the remaining downstream segments of Bayou de Loutre to the Louisiana State Line. These changes will not adversely impact the environment.
- 6. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 2, Tyson Foods Third-Party Rulemaking; Docket No. 13-005-R.
  - a. Amendment Proposed By: Tyson Foods Inc. Waldron Plant
- b. Description: Tyson Foods filed its request to initiate rulemaking on April 9, 2013. Tyson proposes to revise Regulation 2 by modifying the state water quality standards for chloride, sulfates, and total dissolved solids.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on May 23, 2013, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: There is no current economically feasible treatment technology for the removal of the minerals. Reverse osmosis treatment technology is not cost effective and generates a concentrated waste stream that is environmentally difficult to dispose of. That technology is not required to meet the designated uses and would produce no significant environmental protection.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking has no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- 7. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 2, City of Huntsville Third-Party Rulemaking; Docket No. 13-006-R.
  - a. Amendment Proposed By: City of Huntsville
- b. Description: City of Huntsville filed its request to initiate rulemaking on June 12, 2013. City of Huntsville proposes to revise the chloride, sulfate, total dissolved solids water quality criteria in Town Branch from the point of discharge of the City of Huntsville wastewater treatment plant downstream to the confluence with Holman Creek; in the Holman Creek from the confluence with Town Branch downstream to the confluence with War Eagle Creek; in War Eagle Creek from the confluence with Holman Creek; and remove the designated but not existing Domestic Water Supply use from Town Branch and Holman Creek.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on July 26, 2013, and no final decision has been made.

c. Justification: The economic effects of the proposed rule are significant and beneficial for Huntsville. Huntsville has investigated technologies and alternatives to comply with the

current minerals criteria, which is summarized in the Report. Reasonable available control technology does not exist that would allow Huntsville to discharge in a manner that would maintain the existing minerals criteria. Approval of the proposed rule modifying the criteria to reflect long term historical site specific conditions is the only reasonable approach so that the permit limits can be adjusted

- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking has no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- 8. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 21, Arkansas Asbestos Abatement Regulation; Docket No. 13-009-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.
- b. Description: ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on August 9, 2013. Changes to Regulation 21 are being proposed in order to incorporate public input after an extensive two-year collaborative workgroup effort between the ADEQ and stakeholders. Proposed significant revisions to Regulation 21 include: Changes in the definition of "Regulated asbestoscontaining material (RACM)."; Elimination of non-mandatory language in the Asbestos Inspection section; Clarification of language in the Notice of Intent (NOI) Section regarding information required prior to beginning renovation projects; Addition of language to the NOI section concerning activities involving resilient floor covering renovation projects, and changes in owners or operators; Clarification of requirements in the Record Keeping Section for storage and submission of on-site documents; Addition and deletion of language for clarification purposes in the Work Procedures Applicability chapter and Licensing Requirements Exemptions subchapter; Addition language to the Out of State Training subchapter; Clarification of the list of necessary documents under the Minimum Record Keeping Requirements subchapter; Addition of a new chapter for Accreditation Certificates; and Deletion of two sections involving fees for demolition of certain amounts of RACM. Several changes were also made for clarification and consistency

purposes, or to update typographical errors throughout Regulation No. 21. These revisions are non-substantive items.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on August 23, 2013, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: The purpose of this proposed rule is to incorporate stakeholders' input in order to clarify Regulation No. 21. The Department also finds it necessary to propose changes to add or delete language for clarity in requirements for record keeping, training provider licenses, documents required for certifications or renewal of licenses and to correct the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA Asbestos Construction standard citation.
- **d. Economic Impact:** This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- **9. Regulation Number and Name:** Regulation No. 2, Third-Party Rulemaking, City of Fayetteville Paul R. Noland Wastewater Treatment Plant; Docket No. 13-010-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: City of Fayetteville Paul R. Noland Wastewater Treatment Plant ("City of Fayetteville").
- b. Description: City of Fayetteville filed its request to initiate rulemaking on October 11, 2013. These amendments concern Regulation No. 2. Proposed changes involve amending Arkansas Water Quality Standards for minerals for the White River from the discharge of the Noland Wastewater Treatment Plant to immediately downstream of the confluence of Richland Creek.

The Commission initiated the rulemaking process on October 25, 2013, and no final decision has been made.

c. Justification: Fayetteville is not seeking a change from historical water quality conditions in the White River; rather Fayetteville seeks a site-specific modification which allows the Noland Wastewater Treatment Plant to be compliant with its NPDES

Permit while making certain that its effluent does not limit the attainment of any of the designated uses of the stream segments.

- **d. Economic Impact:** City of Fayetteville states that there will be no cost to the agency. The amendments will have no financial impact on small business.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No environmental benefit analysis is required for this regulation.
- 10. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 11, Regulations for Solid Waste Disposal Fees; Landfill Post-Closure Trust Fund; and Recycling Grants Program; Docket No. 13-011-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.
- **b. Description:** ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on November 21, 2013. ADEQ proposes revisions to Regulation No. 11 to incorporate statutory changes passed by the General Assembly that amend various provisions of the Solid Waste Management and Recycling Fund Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 8-6-601 et seq., particularly Act 1333 of 2013 and Act 819 of 2011.

The Commission adopted the amendments to the regulation on May 22, 2014.

- c. Justification: This rulemaking establishes the Recycling Fund and eliminates future disbursements from the repealed Recycling Grants Program. Further, the proposed rulemaking will clarify provisions concerning the management of Recycling Grant funds previously distributed. It will also clarify the Computer and Electronic Equipment Recycling Grants program.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.

- 11. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 12, Regulated Storage Tanks; Docket No. 14-001-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.
- **b. Description:** ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on January 9, 2014. ADEQ proposes revisions to Regulation No. 12 to make the regulation comply with state legislation affecting the state's RST program, specifically Act 809 of 2011 and Act 406 of 2013.

The Commission adopted the amendments to the regulation on June 22, 2014.

- c. Justification: The proposed revision is designed to make Regulation No. 12 comply with state legislation affecting the state's RST program, specifically Act 809 of 2011 and Act 406 of 2013.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- 12. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 5, Ozark Society and the Arkansas Public Policy Panel Third-Party Rulemaking; Docket No. 14-002-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Ozark Society and the Arkansas Public Policy Panel.
- b. Description: The Ozark Society and the Arkansas Public Policy Panel ("Ozark Society") filed its request to initiate rulemaking on April 11, 2014. The proposed changes to APCEC Regulations 5 seek to prohibit the ADEQ Director from issuing Regulation No. 5 permits for Confined Animal Operations for facilities in the Buffalo National River Watershed with either 750 or more swine weighing 55 pounds or more, or 3,000 or more swine weighing less than 55 pounds. The regulation changes will

prohibit an increase in the number of swine at existing facilities in the Buffalo National River Watershed.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on April 25, 2014, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: The regulation changes will prohibit an increase in the number of swine at existing facilities in the Buffalo National River Watershed, and prevent the future establishment of medium and large confined animal operations in the Buffalo River Watershed.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking will not impact the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.
- e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
- 13. Regulation Number and Name: Regulation No. 6, Ozark Society and the Arkansas Public Policy Panel Third-Party Rulemaking; Docket No. 14-003-R.
- a. Amendment Proposed By: Ozark Society and the Arkansas Public Policy Panel.
- b. Description: The Ozark Society and the Arkansas Public Policy Panel ("Ozark Society") filed its request to initiate rulemaking on April 11, 2014. The proposed changes to APCEC Regulations 6 seek to prohibit the ADEQ Director from issuing Regulation No. 6 permits for Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations for facilities in the Buffalo National River Watershed with either 750 or more swine weighing 55 pounds or more, or 3,000 or more swine weighing less than 55 pounds. The regulation changes will prohibit an increase in the number of swine at existing facilities in the Buffalo National River Watershed.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on April 25, 2014, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: The regulation changes will prohibit an increase in the number of swine at existing facilities in the Buffalo National River Watershed, and prevent the future establishment of medium and large confined animal feeding operations in the Buffalo River Watershed.

- a. Amendment Proposed By: Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality.
- **b. Description:** ADEQ filed its request to initiate rulemaking on May 7, 2014. Proposed changes to Regulation 6 involve the addition of a new section, Reg. 6.207, which would establish public notification procedures whenever an applicant files a Notice of Intent to apply for a General Permit for a Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation under Regulation 6.

The Commission adopted the minute order initiating the rulemaking process on May 22, 2014, and no final decision has been made.

- c. Justification: Act 1511 of 2013 created a Committee and charged it with developing a policy for providing public notification for any Notice of Intent filed with the Department for a general permit involving a proposed Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation ("CAFO") in Arkansas. The purpose of this proposed rule is to incorporate the Committee's input in order to incorporate additional public notice procedures to be followed by any applicant for the CAFO general permit issued pursuant to Regulation No. 6.
- d. Economic Impact: This rulemaking adopts a federal requirement and there will be no impact to the environment in Arkansas that would not have otherwise occurred.

e. Environmental Benefit Analysis: No Environmental Benefit Analysis is required.
