Dear Mr. Smith:

On March 10, 2009, I performed a recon inspection on a sanitary sewer overflow of the collection system at 302 Scott Street in response to complaint. This was the second incident at the same location within the last 7 days. This inspection was performed in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Clean Water Act, the Arkansas Water and Air Pollution Control Act, and the regulations promulgated thereunder. The inspection revealed the following violations:

- 1. There was evidence to confirm that an overflow of raw sewage had occurred prior to my inspection date. Mr. Steve Dufresne, with the City of Van Buren Utilities Department, reported that the overflow occurred on March 6, 2009. An on-going problem with the transducer was again determined to be the cause of the pump failure at the Fourth Street pump station. Mr. Dufresne provided me a copy of the sanitary sewer overflow report which was submitted to the ADEQ Enforcement Branch.
- 2. During this inspection, I observed a sewer relief overflow pipe in the side bank of the ditch. This overflow pipe appeared to be cast iron and was approximately eight inches in diameter. All discharges would flow directly into the ditch. This pipe allows for the City of Van Buren to discharge untreated effluent to the waters of the State which is a violation of the permit. This sewer relief overflow pipe and any others located throughout the City must be removed.

The above items require your immediate attention. Please submit a written response to these findings to Cindy Garner, Technical Assistance Manager with the Water Division Enforcement Branch at the following address:



A sanitary sewer overflow inspection was conducted in response to a complaint. This is the second complaint at the same location in less than 7 days. Complainant advised that he observed sewage in the ditch located adjacent to his business at 302 Scott Street in Van Buren on the evening of March 6, 2009. On March 9, 2009, I was contacted by Steve Duresne with the City of Van Buren Utilities Department. Mr. Dufresne advised that a second overflow had occurred on the 6 th and on-going problems with the transducer had caused the pump to fail. He also provided me a copy of the sanitary sewer overflow report which had been submitted to the Department. On March 10, 2009, I investigated the location to determine if clean up efforts had taken place. There was evidence of lime that had bee applied in the ditch. During the inspection, I observed a sewer relief overflow pipe in the ditch. It was located approximately 25-30 feet from the manhole. I contacted Steve Dufresne and discussed the overflow pipe. I advised that it was considered to be an intentional discharge of untreated effluent wand was in violation of the permit. I also advised that the pipe and other sewer relief pipes should be capped or removed.

Response to NPDES Compliance Inspection Reports dated March 9, 2009 and March 12, 2009, by Mr. Jeff Tyler pertaining to two SSO's occurring up gradient of 302 Scott Street in Van Buren.

Dear Ms. Garner:

Violation 1. The Sanitary sewer overflows which occurred up gradient of 302 Scott Street on March 1st and March 6th of 2009 were both caused by a transducer malfunction in the new 4th Street Pump Station. The pump station was designed with a pressure transducer in a stilling well, which sends a wet well level signal to the pump controls. It was discovered that the transducer orifices were stopping up with grease, and sending an incorrect signal to the pump control unit; therefore the pumps were not starting and the high level alarm was not functioning. (The control unit was receiving a signal showing only six feet of water in the wet well)

Both SSO occurrences were reported to the ADEQ as required by the NPDES Permit.

On Saturday March 7, 2009, the transducer was removed from the stilling well and placed into the middle of the wet well to prevent grease buildup, and is being cleaned periodically, as of today; we have not had any further problems.

After discussion with Hawkins – Weir Engineers, Inc., it was determined that we should; replace the transducer with a model which has a larger sensor surface, not place the transducer back into the stilling well set up, and install a float sensor as a back up to the transducer. A construction change order has been issued; the parts have all been received and are scheduled to be installed on Monday April 6, 2009 under the current contract with Van Horn Construction.

Violation 2. On March 13, 2009, the overflow relief pipe in the referenced manhole was sealed with concrete from the inside and outside of the manhole.


