Mr. J. Sparrow-

We received your message concerning "abandoned refrigerators" behind the Kappa Sigma fraternity house on the University campus. I called earlier this morning and left a message.

I inspected the location this morning and the refrigerators were gone. This is a privately owned house, but I talked to the Kappa Sigma maintenance man at the house. He indicated there had been 2 or 3 refrigerators in their dumpster a couple of weeks ago. An assumption on my part is that they were dumped by students before returning home for the summer. Although the house is privately owned:

- I have made the maintenance man aware that the University has the facilities and expertise on campus to capture coolants such as Freon and properly dispose of them. I made him aware that landfills would not accept them unless the coolants were properly removed and recovered.
- 2. We will educate the fraternity's leadership on proper disposal of refrigerators and their coolants.
