


On June 6, 1977, a proposal by Mr. L. R. Bryant, Chief Engineer for Reynold's Aluminum, Bryant, Arkansas area, was made reuquesting formal substitution of reclamation for 64.94 acres of pre-law spoil, in lieu of reclaiming 64.94 acres of permitted mined-out land. This request was made during the final month of Act 236 existance and under the provision of Section 16.

Reynolds Aluminum is sole owner of surface and minerals for all land involved in this proposal.

On review and discussion of this proposal with Mr. Bryant, the plan for reclamation of pre-law spoil was good. The permitted area (after mining is completed) will be left as depressions and will surely fill with acid water; these areas (two) will then be required to form permanent impoundments with no overflow.

After checking the feasibility of the proposal, it was decided that the Mined Land Review Committee be made familiar with the proposal. Then on August 12, a formal meeting and field trip was conducted to the properties for final check-out. On the basis of this field trip, the Mined Land Review Committee and the Department of Pollution Control and Ecology were in agreement that the proposal should be placed before the Commission for acceptanc


Dear Mr. Bonner:

In accordance with our conversation of June 6th, we are making formal application to substitute 64.94 acres of land which we now have under permit for 64.94 acres of pre-law mined out area as shown on the attached map.

We feel that it would be both practical and beneficial to make this substitution from a mining and reclamation standpoint. The 47.29 acre area shown in Section #35 and the 17.65 acre area in Section #2 will fall in a final cut and sunken haul road category, while the pre-law spoil area shown in Section #34 is near a populated and highly visible area.

We propose to have 22.3 acres of the pre-law area totally reclaimed (grass and pine seedlings established) by June 1, 1978. We will need five years to reclaim the remaining 42.64 acres.

In reference to our letter dated June 7, 1977, our proposal for reclamation of the pre-law area, as shown on map attached to the above mentioned letter, is to grade all slopes to 3' horizontally and 1' vertically, cover new slopes with top stripping, and establish grass and pine seedlings.
