

Peabody Coal and Mining Company of Clinton, Missouri has requested a reduction of \$1,140.00 from surety bond. This reduction represents 2.28 acres under Peabody Coal & Mining permit #113 under Act 236 State Law, in order to allow its use as a rock stockpile by Chrisman Ready Mix. The area in question was used as a stockpile area prior to mining and they desire full use of the area as soon as possible for this purpose.

On the basis of the company's effort, The Mined Land Review Committee and the Department of Pollution Control and Ecology recommend that the Commission honor this operator's request. This parcel acreage is located in Section 23, T10N, R26W of Franklin County, Arkansas.

Based upon the above and the attached recommendations, the Commission hereby approves this operator's request.

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Request by Peabody Coal Company for reduction of surety on 2.28 acres of permit #113 on the basis of pre-mining usage and current usage of area by Chrisman Sand & Gravel

This acreage has been bladed and graded by Peabody Coal Company to the point of redistribution of top soil and plant-back for revegetation. Chrisman Sand and Gravel operation is located immediately adjoining the south boundary and into the permitted area of Peabody Coal Company. During the last few months, Chrisman has placed aggregate stockpiles on top of Peabody's bladed and graded surface to a total area of 2.28 acres.

It now develops that Peabody cannot revegetate this area covered by the Chrisman operation. On the basis of past land usage, quite a number of years as a stockpile area for the sand & gravel operations, it is believed that a granting of reduction of surety to Peabody Coal Company on this affected 2.28 acres is the best solution for both parties involved.
