MINUTE ORDER NO. 79- 53

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The staff has reviewed the transcript of the public hearing on the construction grants priority list held on August 31, 1979. Based on that review and personal investigations the staff is recommending that the towns of Newark, Washington, and St. Francis be added to the list presented at the hearing. Additionally, the staff recommends that the town of Jacksonport be administratively incorporated into the Diaz project.

By this minute order the Commission on Pollution Control and Ecology approves the 1980 construction grants priority list as presented at the public hearing but with incorporation of the staff recommendations made above.

FY-80 PRIORITY LIST ADDITIONS

PUBLIC HEARING

1. The City of St. Francis is being added to the list due to the overwhelming evidence that a potential public health hazard does exist. St. Francis has attempted to get on the list for the last four years with no success. Our files reveal their need is obvious.

St. Francis is in Clay county very near the Missouri State line.

2. The City of Washington is being added to the list for two reasons. The first is an immediate need due to malfunctioning septic tanks. The second is related to the state park within the city.

The park has already been developed and improved by a considerable margin, with more major improvements scheduled in the near future. The Department of State Parks has verified to us that these improvements will increase park visitation considerably. They have requested help for the city in anticipation of health related problems in the future.

Washington is in Hempstead county. Old Washington State Park is considered the leading historic site in the state.

3. The city of Newark will be added to the list in anticipation of sewer problems that will occur once the construction of the Arkansas Power and Light plant gets underway near there. Newark is already one of the largest unsewered towns in the state. With the expected influx of construction workers the problem will worsen.

Newark is in Independence County near the White River.

4. The city of Jacksonport will hopefully be added to the existing project at Diaz. They are about 2 miles apart.
