
The Commission hereby approves the permit applications submitted by the following firms, subject to the provisions of the Solid Waste Management Act, the Solid Waste Management Code, and the permit terms and conditions.

L & H Sanitation, Inc.

Name of Facility - L & H Sanitation, Inc. Sanitary Landfill, Heber Springs

Additional Conditions - Proper preparation of the site shall be supervised and reported in writing to the Department by a Registered Professional Engineer prior to placement of any waste in the landfill; a total of 3 on-site monitoring wells shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted to the Department. Each well shall be analyzed quarterly during the first year of operation and twice annually thereafter unless more frequent monitoring is deemed necessary by the Department. Results shall be submitted to the Department following analysis, and shall include the following constituents: Fe, Pb, Zn, Mn, Chlorides, TDS, COD, pH, and Total Hardness. Liner shall be utilized as indicated in the submitted engineering plans and over any sandstone ledges encountered.

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Arkansas Commission on Pollution Control and Ecology, in accordance with the Arkansas Water and Air Pollution Control Act of 1949, as amended, issues the following notice of receipt of application for a sanitary landfill permit:

L & H Sanitation, Inc., of Heber Springs, Arkansas, has submitted an application to the Department of Pollution Control and Ecology to construct and operate a sanitary landfill on 40 acres of land located approximately 1½ miles southwest of the town of Wilburn in Cleburne County. The property, which is leased from the owner, is further described as follows: A part of the Southwest ¼, Section 13, and a part of the Southeast ¼, Section 14, Township 10 North, Range 9 West, Cleburne County, Arkansas. The proposed site is presently used for pasture and timberland. The proposed landfill would serve households and businesses in the eastern half of Cleburne County and would accept primarily residential wastes. No hazardous wastes would be allowed in the landfill under the terms of the application.

Any interested party may request a public hearing on the application for the landfill permit. Interested parties may submit written requests for hearing to the following addressee: Jim Bearden, Solid Waste Hearing Officer, Department of Pollution Control and Ecology, 8001 National Drive, P. O. Box 9583, Little Rock, AR 72219. If five (5) such requests are received by the Hearing Officer, or at the Department, by 5:00 p.m., April 19, 1982, a public hearing will be scheduled and notice will be given in accordance with state law.

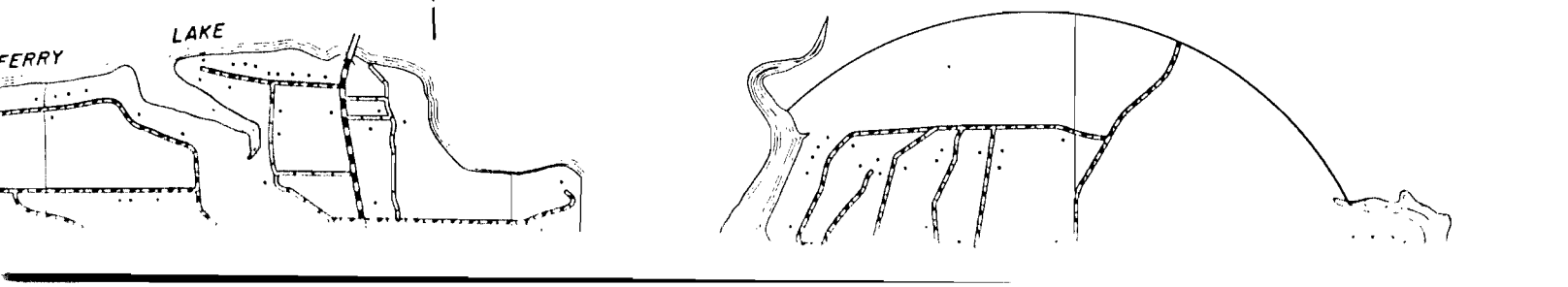
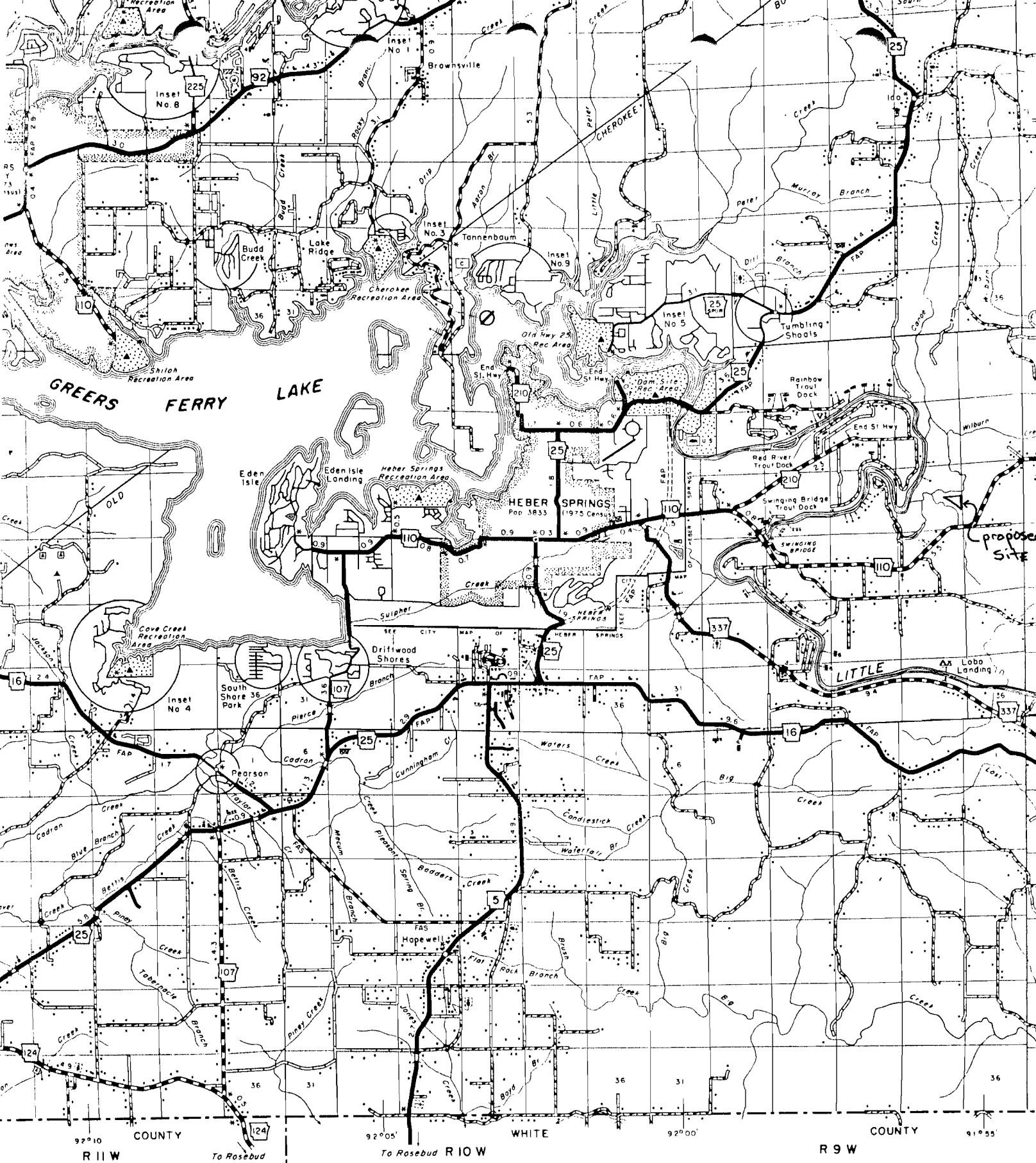

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

- 12 (a) This permit shall expire when the approximate 40 acre disposal described in the final engineering plans has been filled to design capacity.
 - (b) Proper preparation of the site shall be supervised and reported in writing to the Department by a Registered Professional Engineer prior to placement of any waste in the landfill.
 - (c) A total of three on-site monitoring wells shall be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications submitted to the Department. Each well shall be analyzed quarterly during the first year of operation and twice annually thereafter unless more frequent monitoring is deemed necessary by the Department. Results shall be submitted to the Department after each analysis. The analysis shall include the following constituents: Fe, Pb, Zn, Mn, Chlorides, TDS, COD, pH and Total Hardness.
 - (d) Liner shall be utilized as indicated in the submitted engineering plans and over any sandstone ledges encountered.
 - (e) As an adjunct to the additional conditions listed above, the permittee is reminded that the provisions of Condition #1 of this permit shall also be satisfied in the construction, operation, and maintenance of the landfill.

(Application to construct and operate a SLF
off Arkansas Highway #110, near Wilburn)

This will advise that the period for receipt of public requests to conduct a public hearing on the above subject has passed without requests for a public hearing being received.

There was, however, one adverse, unsigned comment received by the permits branch in March purporting potential contamination of a deep well located on the property adjoining the site, an abandoned wildcat oil well on the same property and inadequate underlaying soils. These postulations are known to the solid waste engineers and the permits branch. They advise that the applicants engineer has been made aware of the comments and this should not preclude the applicants permit application being processed.

Therefore, procedures should be initiated to act upon their request without a public hearing and to place it on the Commission Agenda for consideration at the May 28, 1982, meeting.
