






MINUTE ORDER NO. 83-17

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The Department of Pollution Control and Ecology is seeking permission to hold a public hearing to consider the adoption of federal RCRA regulations promulgated or amended from July 27, 1982 to March 1, 1983 and to consider amending Section 13(b)(1); Section 11(o) and 11(p) of the Arkansas Hazardous Waste Management Code.

A summary of the regulations to be adopted by reference and the changes to the Code are attached.

ADOPTIONS BY REFERENCE (SINCE JULY 26, 1982)

August 18, 1982

40 CFR Part 261

This amendment defines when a container which has held a hazardous waste is considered "empty." Today's change allows the use of a weight measurement as an alternative to a depth measurement in determining whether a container is empty.

September 21, 1982

40 CFR Part 122

The first reference in paragraph (a) is revised to include the most current reference publication.

October 12, 1982

40 CFR 262, 264, and 265

EPA clarifies the status of three recordkeeping requirements. These requirements are now in effect:

- (1) The submission of 1981 annual reports.
- (2) The submission of quarterly groundwater monitoring data for surface impoundments, landfills, and land treatment facilities.
- (3) The preparation of groundwater quality assessment program outlines for surface impoundments, landfills, and land treatment facilities.

November 22, 1982

40 CFR 261

EPA temporarily excludes solid wastes generated at several particular generating facilities from the lists of hazardous wastes contained in 40 CFR 261.31 and 261.32. This action responds to delisting petitions submitted under 40 CFR 260.20.

January 19, 1983

40 CFR 122, 260, 264, and 265

Hazardous Waste Management System/Standards for Owners and Operators of Hazardous Waste Treatment, Storage, and Disposal Facilities; Hazardous Waste Permit Program (48 FR 2508-2512).

January 19, 1983 (Cont'd) This amended interim final rule has been published by EPA to make clear that RCRA regulations which govern treatment and storage of hazardous waste are not applicable to actions taken to "immediately contain and treat" spills of hazardous waste or hazardous materials. Persons who treat or store hazardous waste under an emergency response situation need not obtain a RCRA permit for those activities.

January 19, 1983

40 CFR 265

Hazardous Waste Management System/Interim Status Standards for Owners and Operators of Hazardous Waste, Treatment, Storage, and Disposal Facilities (48 FR 2514-2516).

EPA has proposed to amend the regulations for hazardous waste management under RCRA to clarify the scope and applicability of the interim status standards concerning hazardous waste management facilities.

January 20, 1983

40 CFR Part 261

The purpose of these changes is to clarify that facilities that store hazardous wastes prior to recycling are subject to the provisions of Subparts A-L of 264 and A-L 265.

January 28, 1983

40 CFR 122, 262, 264 and 265

This amendment increases the interval between required reports from annual to biennial and require the biennial report to be submitted by March 1 of even numbered years describing hazardous waste activities during the previous calendar year.

Arkansas Hazardous Waste Management Code

Section 13(b)(1)

Generators and all owners or operators of hazardous waste facilities will file a report summarizing their activities related to hazardous waste management by March 1 of each even numbered year which must cover hazardous waste activities during the previous calendar year. The biennial report will be due at the Department of Pollution Control on a form designated by the Department.

Section 11(o)

In addition to the above fees, the costs of mailings, publication of public notices, and other public notification costs incurred by the Department in the processing of a permit application shall be remitted to the Department by the permit applicant. The costs of meeting the notification requirements, as con-

tained in 40 CFR 124.10 and outlined above, shall not exceed actual expenditure by the Department.

Section 11(p)

No permit will be issued when indebtedness exists as a result of non-payment of any of the above permit fees or notification charges.
