

MINUTE ORDER NO. 85-18

By this Minute Order, the Commission on Pollution Control and Ecology hereby adopts the Draft FY'86 Priority System and List as amended based on public comments received during the forty-five (45) day comment period.

Comments received which resulted in amendments to the original draft were as follows:

1. The deletion of the Lead Hill-Diamond City project from the system and list, and the addition of the Sugarloaf Wastewater Improvement District to the system and list to replace the deleted project.
2. The utilization of the "Governor's Set-aside" provision to fund new collectors for unsewered communities at the ratio of one-half the new collector needs for unsewered entities to the total eligible needs as shown on both the large and small communities lists.

Comments received with regard to the utilization of the "emergency bypass" provisions regardless of industrial contributions did not result in an amendment due to the conflict with EPA regulations (40 CFR 35.2125).

In addition, three (3) large grant increases have been awarded thusfar this year to projects due to the bids exceeding the engineering estimates. These increase awards are shown below:
