As a member of the Ozark Society and a frequent floater and camper along the Buffalo National River, I am all for the APC&E Commission's regulations 5 and 6.

The Buffalo River brings in millions of dollars in tourism every year. Outfitters, campgrounds, restaurants, etc. around the area count on that tourism for their livelihood. This is not just an issue of ecology, but one of economy. What are those people to do once their means of making a living is ruined?
