The purpose of the rule is to regulate underground storage tank systems and certain aboveground storage tank systems to protect public health and the lands and waters of the State of Arkansas. The rule also was promulgated pursuant to the Petroleum Storage Tank Trust Fund Act to provide procedures to allow eligible owners or operators to obtain partial reimbursement for costs of corrective action taken in response to accidental release from qualified petroleum storage tank systems. The rule further regulates the licensure of persons who intall, repair, upgrade and close underground storage tank systems. The rule further regulates the licensure of persons who test underground storage tank systems. The rule also provides a process by which operators of underground storage tank systems are trained and certified.
