## Dear Administrator McCarthy:

The Midcontinent States Environmental and Energy Regulators (MSEER) group brings together state officials from 14 midcontinent states<sup>1</sup> to explore and assess implementation options to meet federal CO<sub>2</sub> emissions requirements for existing power plants. MSEER is interested in understanding whether multi-state coordination would reduce costs and bring other benefits to their states compared to a single-state approach. We write to seek clarification from EPA on how EPA proposes to calculate mass-based goals.

As our states consider the various options for 111(d) compliance, it is essential that we have a better sense of what methodologies for calculating mass-based state goals EPA would accept. The material released by EPA on June 2<sup>nd</sup> does not provide enough information for states to evaluate the consequences of considering a mass-based approach. We respectfully request that EPA issue non-binding, illustrative examples of how states could convert their rate-based goals to mass, including the underlying calculations and assumptions.

It is important that states have this additional information before the close of the comment period and with enough time to comment to EPA on the additional information. Given that there are only approximately five (5) weeks left before the current comment period expires on October 16, 2014, we also request an extension of the comment period to allow additional time to develop comments.
