Additions to Regulation No. 35 that were not previously part of Regulations 18, 19, 26, and 31

Regulation No. 35 V2.0 includes some additional definitions and provisions that were not included in the currently adopted versions of Regulations 18, 19, 26, and 31.

Reg. 35.107, Reg. 35.108, and Reg. 35.109 provide for the disposition of Regulations 18, 19, 26, and 31 and the transition to Regulation 35.

Reg. 35.3.303 adds provisions for open burning of storm debris consistent with Ark. Code Ann 8-4-316 as amended in 2017.

Regulation Chapter 3, Subchapter 3.7 adopts the hydrogen sulfide state ambient air quality standards as required under Ark, Code Ann. 8-3-102 and 103.

Chapter 13, Subchapters 13.1 and 13.2 were added to replace the entirety of Regulation No. 31, which has become outdated and is primarily a copy and paste of what Subchapter 13.2 incorporates by reference.

Appendix C provides a crosswalk for the location in Regulation 35 of provisions previously contained in Regulations 18, 19, 26, and 31.
