

## NOTICE OF RECEIVING BIDS For ADEQ MEDICAL MONITORING

The Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) is soliciting bids from qualified Medical Facilities to provide medical monitoring of select ADEQ staff. The ADEQ Medical Monitoring Program is designed to monitor the health of employees that may be exposed to hazardous substances. This program establishes the minimum medical qualifications for individuals to work with hazardous substances in the Offices of Air Quality and Land Resources.

The ADEQ Medical Monitoring Program will, at a minimum, meet the requirements of the OSHA Regulation 29 CFR 1910.120(f). The ADEQ Medical Monitoring Program includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Medical Monitoring Services Program Development and Implementation
- Medical Review of All Physical Examinations
- Medical Surveillance Program
- Medical Resource Department
- Medical Review and Approval of Return to Duty Releases
- Consultation Regarding Employee Health Related Issues

The deadline for submitting the cost estimate form and any other details will be 4:00 p.m. on March 1, 2019.
