PC&EC to Hold Meeting via Zoom

NORTH LITTLE ROCK—In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, a state of emergency has been declared for the State of Arkansas. During this critical time the Arkansas Department of Energy and Environment (E&E) and the Pollution Control and Ecology Commission (PC&EC) are taking precautions to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Accordingly, the PC&EC meeting scheduled for Friday, March 26, 2021, will be held via Zoom video conferencing starting at 9:00 a.m. The PC&EC March 2021 meeting agenda includes a report from the Director of the Division of Environmental Quality; a presentation from Arkansas Quail Forever regarding the importance of pollinators and pollinator habitat in Arkansas; a request for a favorable vote on a Recommended Decision issued by PC&EC's administrative law judge in the Matter of Two Rivers Harbor POA, Docket No. 21-001-P; and a request for oral argument and vote on a Recommended Decision In the Matter of Elemental Environmental Solutions, LLC, Docket No. 20-004-P.
