


From phone conversation: <b>"The complainant stated that he had received the information from a farmer in the area. The complainant was told that one of the watershed ditches that runs east between section 33 and 34 had a break in it due to the Red River flooding. He stated that he understood that Domtar was in the process of repairing the break, but wanted ADEQ to know so we could keep an eye on it because it was nasty stuff in the ditch."</b>

<b>INVESTIGATION &amp; ACTION TAKEN</b>			
I met with Brandon Ayers, Senior Env. Engineer, Domtar A.W. Corporation at approximately 12:30 on 7/21/2015 and explained the complaint. He stated that he had reported the break to ADEQ on 6/19/2015 after the flood waters receded. I had evidence of that report as he copied me. I asked where Domtar was on the repair. He stated that the repair had started in the previous couple of days as it was too wet to get the heavy equipment to the site. We then went to the site and I noted that the break was approximately 40-50 wide. Mr. Ayers stated that the current from the flood flowed perpendicularly across the open canal and washed out the east levee. At that time, Domtar would have to build a crossing big enough for the heavy equipment to access the east-side. He felt that any effluent that flowed from out of the canal at that point would remain on Domtar property till it reached the Red River as Domtar owned the adjacent property. <b>For further info, see Reconnaissance Inspection dated 7/21/2015.</b>
