Section D: Summary of Findings/Comments (Attach additional sheets if necessary)

On July 10, 2006, I investigated a complaint in regards to the City of Berryville POTW having an overflow in the collection system near 703 S. Main St. In regards to the complaint, an SSO report was submitted to the Department as required by the permit. According to Kirby Murry's report submitted to the Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality, the sanitary sewer overflow occurred on July 10, 2006. On July 10, 2006, 500 gallons overflowed in the collection system due to a clogged line. The overflow stopped on July 10, 2006. At the time of investigation, there were some solids that had not been cleaned up around the pipe as well as effluent entering a dry creek bed. I spoke with James Mendyk on July 10, 2006. He stated that Dewayne Allen and Kirby Murray were out of the office. He stated that he had stopped the overflow earlier in the morning and would be cleaning up the area later in the day. Mr. Murry contacted me to inform me that they had located a bad spot in the pipe and would be repairing the pipe.
