On June 2, 2010, in response to a citizen's complaint regarding a manhole overflow, I performed a routine inspection of the city's wastewater collection system, specifically Gulpha Creek Pump Station, in accordance with the provisions of the federal Clean Water ACT, the Arkansas Water and Air Pollution Control Act, and the regulations promulgated there under. This inspection revealed that the manhole just prior to the Gulpha Creek Pump Station has had a significant overflow. Evident debris displays evidence of this overflow entering the waters of the state located just a short distance away.

Since you have complied with the notification of noncompliance requirements of your permit, no further response is necessary pertaining to the overflow itself. However, I would like for you to address the debris that had been left behind as a result of this overflow. The area will need to be cleaned and disinfected.

The above item requires your immediate attention. Please submit a written response to these findings to Cindy Garner, Water Division Enforcement Branch Manager. This response should be mailed to the address below. This response should contain documentation describing the course of action taken to correct each item noted. This corrective action should be completed as soon as possible, and the written response with all necessary documentations (i.e. pictures) is due by June 26, 2010.



Dear Ms. Garner:

This letter is in response to the letter received June 17, 2010 from Jim McSwain pertaining to issues identified at our Gulpha Pump Station on June 14, 2010. The initial overflow was due to an excessive rainfall in a very brief period on June 11, 2010, the station had reached its capacity and was overflowing until the system was able to recover and excessive flows subside. Following the overflow, crews were dispatched and cleaned up debris that was accessible, the crew failed to return when the stream had returned to normal level. Upon notification by Mr. McSwain (June 14, 2010), we dispatched a work group to the site for further remediation of debris left behind as a result of the overflow. This morning I met with Shawn Davis (Division Manager) and we will place a "screen" adjacent to the manhole to mitigate the potential for debris to enter the creek should another overflow occur. The area has been properly cleaned and treated as applicable as of this date.
