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PROPOSED PROJECT: DISTRICT EDUCATION APPLICANT BENTON COUNTY RSWMD

- 1. Describe your current recycling program. Explain how it fits into your local solid waste management program and the overall district solid waste plan.
 - Currently, the Solid Waste District provides a recycling collection program in several locations as well as a route collection program for schools and non-profits throughout Benton County. In addition, several other private and public entities recycle various products. These programs are integral parts of the District's integrated solid waste management system.
- 2. How will the proposed project enhance or improve the current recycling program?

 The proposed project will allow the District to conduct an education campaign throughout Benton County in partnership with several cities. The increased awareness of recycling and management practices will increase participation in recycling District-wide
- 3. What will the project accomplish and how will it be accomplished? How will success of the project be measured? Pursuant to the District's 2011 Solid Waste Plan, our education program goals will include:
 - Work with solid waste consultant to develop Community Advisory Boards in all communities with representatives who will take turns attending the solid waste board meetings. They will then disseminate information from the district to their community at-large.
 - Create a Best Practices Benton County packet that includes information about business waste reduction, composting, drop off signage, drop off sites, innovative collection programs, event recycling, and education programs that result in measureable waste stream reduction, etc. The packet will be available electronically. It will be offered to every library and school in each community and announced in each newspaper and on every city website.
 - Expand presentation of the Recycling Basics Luncheon series.
 Grant funds will partially be used to contract with a consultant to perform specified tasks from this scope of work.
 Remaining funds will be used to hire an environmental intern to conduct presentations to schools and civic groups and to develop education materials.
- 4. What actions will be taken to begin the project before pre-applications for the next grant round are submitted to ADEQ (July 15)? What actions will be taken to complete the project and spend all grant funds within three years?

 Once grant funds become available, we will select the contractor and enter into an agreement with them. The agreement will require that the scope of work be completed no later than June 30, 2012 and all reports and deliverables be provided to the District at that time. We will post the intern job at NWACC and University of Arkansas. Once grant funds become available, we will select the intern and assign appropriate projects.
- 5. Who will participate in and benefit from this project? How will they participate or benefit? If partnerships are involved, describe each partner's role in the project.
 - The education campaigns will be aimed at reaching all citizens of Benton County. The community advisory committees will be made up of representatives from businesses, schools, churches, civic and community groups. They will partner with the district on issues specific to their community. The intern's activities will be focused on school age children and civic organizations.
- 6. How will the public be made aware of recycling or other opportunities provided by this project? Describe the educational message to be delivered and the method(s) of delivery. When available, provide a copy of any materials developed.
 - The education campaign will focus on all aspects of our integrated solid waste management system. We will utilize the community advisory committees, social media, our website, printed materials and other media outlets to deliver the messages. We will focus on best practices with an emphasis on waste reduction and recycling

All grants are subject to the requirements of A.C.A. 8-6-601 et. Seq. and Arkansas Pollution Control and Ecology Commission Regulation 11, Chapter Four: Solid Waste Management and Recycling Grants Program.

The following items are not eligible for funding from recycling grants:

Taxes

Reimbursement of funds

Retroactive purchases

Legal fees

Licenses or permits

Vehicle registration

Utilities

GRANT RECIPIENTS AGREE TO:


- Actively develop a recycling program, as outlined in the grant application, and expend all grant funds in the three (3) years following the date of the grant award by the department.
- Actively seek to market or reuse the materials diverted under the recycling program from deposition in landfills in the period of three (3) years following the date of the grant award by the department.
- Start grant project before July 15, the date pre-applications for the next grant round are due to the department.
- Use facilities or equipment purchased with grant funds <u>no less than 50 percent</u> of the time on the purposes specified in the grant application.
- Use any interest earned on grant funds exclusively for recycling programs consistent with the Regional Solid Waste Management District's Solid Waste Management Plan.
- Maintain an orderly accounting system to document that grant expenditures are made in accordance with project budget. This includes keeping copies of all bids, paid invoices, canceled checks, and other appropriate paperwork.
- Report for five years after receipt of grant funds or until all funds are expended, whichever is longer, as directed by statute and regulation.
- Conform to all state laws on the purchase, use or sale of equipment and facilities secured with grant funds.
- Seek competitive bids or requests for proposals (RFP) for purchase of equipment or services as required by state and local procurement laws.
- Receive written approval from the Board and the department for any modifications to the grant, including requests for time extensions.
- Receive written consent from the Board and department before selling, trading or transferring facilities or equipment.

REGIONAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT BOARDS AGREE TO ensure recipients conform to requirements and to:

- Establish or designate at least one adequate recyclable materials collection center in each county as required in Arkansas Pollution Control & Ecology Commission Regulation 28.
- Ensure the grantee show adequate revenues are being collected to support the long-term operation and maintenance of a grant-funded project prior to the disbursal of grant funds.
- Ensure all applicable federal, state and local permits and licenses have been obtained.
- Ensure the project has begun before disbursing funds.
- Notify ADEQ in the event a recipient has not met conditions of the approved grant application.
- Ensure that the project is compatible with the approved RSWMD plan on file with ADEQ or submit documentation demonstrating why a deviation is necessary.
- Compile annual reports as required.







Grant application must include: answers to the Project Proposal questions, a complete Budget and Proof of Publication, as required. Copies of any comments received regarding the grant request shall be forwarded to ADEQ.

Incomplete grant applications will not be considered and may delay processing of grant funds.

Signature and Certification

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The authorized representative of the organization applying for the grant and the Regional Solid Waste Management Board Chairman both must sign the application. The authorized representative must have the authority to obligate the applicant's resources.
