The purpose of this grant is to administer the White River District Regional Solid Waste Management Plan as instructed by our Board of Directors. The White River RSWMD provides technical assistance and grant funding to eight recycling processing and shipping centers, two satellite centers, seven curbside recycling programs, and ten community drop-off recycling programs in our ten county service area as directed by our District's Solid Waste Plan.

2. How will the proposed project enhance or improve the current recycling program?

This project will provide the continued technical and financial assistance to communities to more efficiently manage their solid waste stream through solid waste education and through programs that include waste reduction, recycling, composting, and waste services oversight.

3. What will the project accomplish and how will it be accomplished? How will success of the project be measured?

Administrative grant funds will be used in conducting the Certificate of Need program, licensing and oversight of solid waste haulers, technical assistance to communities on solid waste management issues, providing technical support to our Board of Directors, assisting in conducting Board meetings, administering and maintaining all files on the Solid Waste Management and Recycling Grant Program, and implementing solid waste management activities as directed by the Board. The success of these programs is a determination of the White River Solid Waste Management Board of Directors based upon the District goals set forth in the Solid Waste Management Plan.

4. What actions will be taken to begin the project before pre-applications for the next grant round are submitted to ADEQ (July 15)? What actions will be taken to complete the project and spend all grant funds within three years?

## GRANT RECIPIENTS AGREE TO:

- ◆ Actively develop a recycling program, as outlined in the grant application, and expend all grant funds in the three (3) years following the date of the grant award by the department.
- ◆ Actively seek to market or reuse the materials diverted under the recycling program from deposition in landfills in the period of three (3) years following the date of the grant award by the department.
- ◆ Start grant project before July 15, the date pre-applications for the next grant round are due to the department.
- ◆ Use facilities or equipment purchased with grant funds no less than 50 percent of the time on the purposes specified in the grant application.
- ◆ Use any interest earned on grant funds exclusively for recycling programs consistent with the Regional Solid Waste Management District's Solid Waste Management Plan.
- ◆ Maintain an orderly accounting system to document that grant expenditures are made in accordance with project budget. This includes keeping copies of all bids, paid invoices, canceled checks, and other appropriate paperwork.
- ◆ Report for five years after receipt of grant funds or until all funds are expended, whichever is longer, as directed by statute and regulation.
- ◆ Conform to all state laws on the purchase, use or sale of equipment and facilities secured with grant funds.
- ◆ Seek competitive bids or requests for proposals (RFP) for purchase of equipment or services as required by state and local procurement laws.
- ◆ Receive written approval from the Board and the department for any modifications to the grant, including requests for time extensions.
- ◆ Receive written consent from the Board and department before selling, trading or transferring facilities or equipment.

**REGIONAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT BOARDS AGREE TO** ensure recipients conform to requirements and to:

- ◆ Establish or designate at least one adequate recyclable materials collection center in each county as required in Arkansas Pollution Control & Ecology Commission Regulation 28.
- ◆ Ensure the grantee show adequate revenues are being collected to support the long-term operation and maintenance of a grant-funded project prior to the disbursement of grant funds.
- ◆ Ensure all applicable federal, state and local permits and licenses have been obtained.
- ◆ **Ensure the project has begun before disbursing funds.**



# No. 10 Gamecocks would to 'bash' Hogs in Fayetteville

COLUMBIA, S.C. — Steve Spurrier was so impressed with Arkansas last year, he all but shut down practice for two days after the Razorbacks' victory to let the Gamecocks watch the game tape over and over again.

The South Carolina coach hopes the Gamecocks paid close attention.

South Carolina (7-1, 5-1 Southeastern Conference) travels to Arkansas to face the eighth-ranked Razorbacks (7-1, 3-1) Saturday in a critical matchup.

"You have to admire the way they play," Spurrier said Tuesday. "It'll be a big challenge for us."

Perhaps the biggest one South Carolina has faced all year.

The Gamecocks are tied with No. 18 Georgia for the SEC Eastern Division lead and, while they hold the tiebreaker over the Bulldogs, they know they can't afford any slipups down the stretch.

That means containing an Arkansas team that's won four of the past five meetings in the series — and most of those in blowout fashion. That includes last year's 41-20 pounding at Williams-Brice Stadium when Ryan Mallett threw for 303 yards and tailback Knile Davis rushed for three touchdowns.

"It's going to be a real big test," Gamecocks linebacker Antonio Allen said. "They just came in here and beat the crap out of us. We want to get that taste out of our mouths."

Mallett left for the NFL and Davis was lost for the season after breaking his ankle at practice this summer. Still, it hasn't slowed down the Razorbacks' passing attack that much. The Hogs lead the SEC in passing yards and Mallett's replacement, junior Tyler Wilson, is No. 1 in league passing average.

South Carolina defensive coordinator Lorenzo Ward says Wilson throwing just three interceptions in 279 attempts this season is testament to his skill as a passer and the reason Arkansas is operating at such a level.

"There are some throws that Ryan Mallett made that Tyler might not make, but they're still the same offense," Ward said.

Then again, Wilson and the Razorbacks may not have seen too many defenses like they'll



face with South Carolina Gamecocks are third powers Alabama and defense and points game. They are second against the pass.

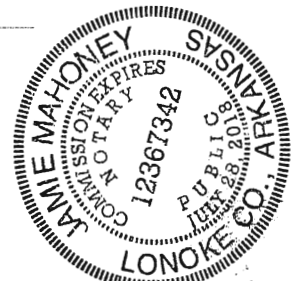
