Bailey we meet with the City yesterday on this project. We presented findings of the SSES to Mayor Halbrook and to Coy Dale, the wastewater superintendent. The findings of the SSES showed that there are 5 areas in the City collection system that need repairs to stop infiltration. Two of these involve creek crossing where the majority of the infiltration is coming from. We reviewed the flow logs yesterday at the plant and confirmed that the infiltration has gotten worse since the large rains earlier this year. There are also a few issues at the treatment plant that need to be rehabbed and brought up to date as the facility is nearly 30 years old.

We have estimated that the cost of the collection system repairs and the work at the plant will be in the range of 400 to 450 thousand dollars. This amount of work is not something that the City can undertake with its existing staff and funds. Therefore, the City will have to secure funding and will bid the work out. City staff has made many minor repairs such as missing caps and plugs that they were capable of doing in house.

Attached is a revised schedule for the CAP based on the information gathered and our best estimates on securing funding. You will see on the schedule that we are presenting all of this information to the City Council on the 21<sup>st</sup> of June. At that council we will seek authorization from the council to proceed forward with applications to the Water and Wastewater Advisory Committee (WWAC) for funding for the project. We do not anticipate any issues with the Council approving the work to secure funds, but we will keep you informed. We have been a bit aggressive with the schedule, but its our understanding the funding is available from the State and Federal Agencies and we are going to be actively working to secure what is needed for Melbourne.

We are also going to start doing monthly updates with you due to our accelarated pace. Our next update will be on July 1, 2018. If you have any questions or comments, please do not hesitate to contact us.
