This letter serves as the referenced Quarterly Report. As in the previous quarterly report, the primary activities in this quarter centered on three areas: 1) continued development of the project to construct a pipeline to the Ouachita River; 2) settlement of the NPDES appeal, and; 3) continued use of an alternative organism in our wastewater treatment system. The following paragraphs present details regarding these issues.

During the first quarter of 2004, there were additional meetings in El Dorado at which the four interested entities (El Dorado Chemical Company, Great Lakes Chemical Corporation, Lion Oil Company and El Dorado Water Utility) continued efforts to coordinate the joint pipeline project. During this quarter the cost allocation process and funding options were discussed and the rate increase needed to support the Utility's portion of the project was determined. The Utility proposed the rate increase to the El Dorado City Council, which deferred action until the required public hearing was conducted. The public hearing is scheduled for April 8, 2004 and we anticipate finalization of City Council actions on the rate increase during the second quarter.

As reported in previous quarterly reports, the NPDES permit appeal was settled through the finalization of a Permit Appeal Resolution (PAR) between ADEQ and EDCC. During this quarter the ADEQ proposed a draft NPDES permit which we commented on along with another party which requested a hearing. ADEQ granted a hearing which is scheduled for April 13, 2004.

As discussed in previous quarterly reports, during the first quarter of 2004 EDCC continued implementation of the alternative wastewater treatment technology at the EDCC Plant. We continue the collection of performance data to determine the efficacy of the organisms in our system.
