It has taken me a while to take a firm stance on the subject of the large hog farm in the Buffalo River Watershed. I am from an agricultural background. My family raises cattle. I believe in landowner rights. I don't want anyone telling me what I can or can't do, so I have been quiet. However, I believe that my method of ranching (management intensive grazing) is environmentally friendly and sustainable. I am a good neighbor. I am not a polluter. There is no way this large hog operation can make that claim. They have not considered the effect they are causing on the area, especially the Buffalo.

Over the past 10 years I have spent a lot of time kayaking and camping on the Buffalo. I see a definite change in the water quality of the lower Buffalo in the past two years, and feel it will only become worse over time. Something must be done to stop this!

Please deny the Regulation 5 permit for the C&H swine factory in the Buffalo River watershed.
