located in Ashley County.

Either way, your comments will become part of the official record, and you will receive written notification of the final permit decision.

Permit conditions

Draft Permit #AR0001210, AFIN 02-00013 for Georgia-Pacific LLC — Crossett Paper Operations Facility is a renewal permit under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and the Arkansas Water and Air Pollution Control Act. The draft permit sets conditions and requirements regarding:

- Disposal of liquids and solids
- Record keeping

The applicant

The permit applicant is Georgia-Pacific LLC — Crossett Paper Operations Facility. The facility is located at 100 Mill Supply Road, Cossett, AR in Ashley County off HWY 82 and Paper Mill Road.

- The facility produces 257 tons per day of fine paper and 1,512 tons per day of paperboard and tissue paper for consumption. This process produces and treats wastewater which is discharged along with sanitary wastewater, landfill leachate, site stormwater, chemical plant, building products, treated effluent from the city of Crossett, truck wash and backwash wastewater in parts of the Ouachita River Basin.
- The permit renewal significant changes include corrections to the facility

coordinates and name, the deletion and addition of particulate limits, the removal and addition of certain monitoring and reporting requirements, and the modification/rewording of parts of the original permit.

ADEQ Permitting Decisions

ADEQ's Water Division staff has developed a draft permit that protects the environment. We take our responsibility seriously, and we do consider comments the public offers us.

Following tonight's hearing, ADEQ will review and respond to all comments, and will make a final permit decision based on environmental law applicable to this facility.

When final permitting decisions are issued, all who offered comments and a legible, complete mailing address will receive a Response to Comments document. In the case of comments submitted by petition, the Department may send its response to a representative of those signing the petition.

The Department's role is to protect human health and the environment from the threat of pollution.
