Dear Ms. Reiber:

Georgia-Pacific Consumer Operations LLC, Crossett Paper Operations plans to replace an existing sanitary sewer septic tank which services the mill's Safety Department offices. This septic tank currently drains to the Wastewater Treatment System. The new tank will be similar in size and function but will be a plastic tank, in lieu of the current concrete tank due to logistical issues with the replacement. Also, the new tank will be installed in the same general area and continue to discharge to the Wastewater Treatment System. The sanitary flow and load will be consistent with the representations in our permit renewal application. The existing tank will be permanently abandoned in place by filling with sand, concrete or other suitable material. We do not believe that this change will result in a change in loading to the Wastewater Treatment System and would like to request that the agency consider this a "minor revision to the existing treatment system" as allowed by Reg. 6.202(C).
