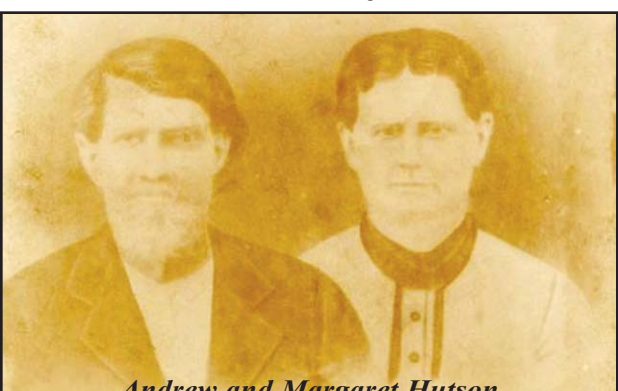

### NOTICE OF ANNUAL ELECTION FOR CALICO ROCK SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 50 OF IZARD COUNTY, ARKANSAS

In accordance with the requirements of Arkansas Code Ann. 6-14-109, Notice is hereby given that the Annual School Election in the above named School District will be held on September 15, 2015, for the following purposes:

- (1) To elect one member to the Board of Directors for a term of five years.
- (2) To submit the question of voting a total School District Levy of 42.3 mills. This total tax levy includes 25 mills for Maintenance and Operation and 17.3 mills for Debt Service previously voted as a Continuing Debt Service Tax pledged for the retirement of existing Bonded Indebtedness. Surplus Revenues produced each year by Debt Service Millage may be used for other school purposes.
