WATER TOWER PROJECT: Before the Covid-19 outbreak, students at Melbourne School District in Meghan Warner's Pre-AP Geometry class were assigned to build "water towers". The projects were due the week school was dismissed for the outbreak. The instructions were to model the water tower after an existing water tower, calculate the volume of water the tower could hold, and compare it to an existing water tower. Students would also have received extra credit if the model they built could hold water as well. Student Weston Edwards had successfully completed his project ahead of time. Using the conversion factor of 7.48 gallons per cubic foot, the real water tower holds around 281,500 gallons, and his model water tower holds about 2.75 gallons and does not leak!
