Please see the attached video and photos. This is the location of Mill Bayou at Roland Cutoff on the bridge, and the area leading to the bridge and the path the effluent would take if the NPDES permit for Paradise Valley is approved. It is dry. The treated sewage would stagnate.

Again there is NO FLOW in Mill Bayou during dry seasons and this is evidence to show what the community has been saying and stated at the public hearing and comments with standing.

Please deny the permit. The developer has other options that don't affect other people's health.

Placing a treatment plant in this location is highly inappropriate. Please don't force this option contrary to good science.

Is the fact of the dry creek bed and no flow going to be ignored like the planned but never built detention pond everyone signed off on years ago including the developer as part of the CAW-Waterview Estates settlement and was planned to be at the very place where Paradise Valley is now and it's not being built is resulting in the flooding and contamination issues of Mill Bayou and surrounding properties that we have today? Correct me if wrong but I think that was partly an ADEQ responsibility to regulate?

Please don't ignore this. Science is sometimes inconvenient for the developer just like knowing the truth. Time favors the truth and so the truth becomes known. We know why we are flooding now.
