Given that this permit was issues in error and disregard for public input and safety, a further modification of the permit would be irresponsible.

The CAFO should not be in the Buffalo watershed or in karst at all. The untreated sewage could contaminate area wells (the probability is high in karst) and monitoring has already found noncompliance in stream samples just downstream of the CAFO. Errors in mapping and other issues, resulting in a flawed Environmental Assessment (what we called the EA in graduate school) and a court ruling against the permitting process as practiced should make prohibition of a modification obviously necessary.

The folks in NPS and AR Fish and Game are doing their jobs. You should do yours. The national river is too valuable to be sacrificed to hog farming.
