The report states:

The facility received 24,534 tons of yard waste during 2021.
Of that, 5,147 tons of product was disposed in the Class 1 landfill; 18,128 tons were used as alternative daily cover on the Class 1 landfill; 0 tons were composted; and 1,259 tons were recycled or sold (see Appendix C).

So was the yard waste grinded and turned into mulch?
