EV CHARGING STATIONS INSTALLATION IS COMPL







Installation of three **Level 2 dual port electric vehicle (EV)** charging stations at the Arkansas Department of Energy and Environment (E&E) headquarters at 5301 Northshore Drive in North Little Rock is completed. While priority for the charging stations is E&E's fleet of electric vehicles and the employees who drive electric, out-of-town visitors also are welcome to "pull in and charge up" when passing by E&E near I-430 and I-40.

E&E REACHES LEVEL 2 EVSE REBATE MILESTONE 2022 FUNDING OF \$215,563 TO BE AVAILABLE SOON

E&E recently processed the 50th rebate for the installation of Level 2 Electric Vehicle Supply Equipment (EVSE) for 2021. To date, 51 charging stations have been installed and rebated across the state. The Level 2 EVSE program is funded under the State Environmental Mitigation Trust established pursuant to the Volkswagen Settlement. While only \$3,452.06 of the initial \$215,563 funding remains for 2021, an additional \$215,563 for 2022 will be available soon.
