LIQUID PROPANE SCHOOL BUS RIDE & DRIVE

Barrett Hunnicutt, Co-Director, Arkansas Clean Cities, presented at two Ride & Drive events hosted by Central State Bus Sales last month. These events were held in Fort Smith and North Little Rock on April 11 and 12, respectively. This was an opportunity for school districts to learn about Liquid Propane Gas as an alternative fuel option, and the cost savings associated with propane and bus maintenance compared to traditional buses.

Hunnicutt highlighted information about the Go Red! Program through the Arkansas Department of Energy & Environment, Division of Environmental Quality as an example of funding opportunities schools might access additional funding to make the transition to alternative fuels.
