I was raised on and still live on the same farm. I currently make my living off the farm. However I continue to have an active role in our family farming operation. Therefore, I am very concerned about the issues now before the ADEQ.

I feel that landowners should have options on how they use their land and I feel farming is a viable option in rural Arkansas. I am against the decision to have a third-party rule-making proposal adopted and even considered a permanent adoption. We have the ADEQ and PC&E Commission in place to make these decisions. We should not have any third-party group taking the place of these commissions.

I am in favor of leaving Regulations 5 and 6 as they are. While the current topic is regarding the Buffalo River watershed, I am concerned that if these restrictions are adopted future groups will want to regulate farms in other watershed areas.

I am very much in favor of letting the University of Arkansas research team continue their studies. Please let the research take its course and generate the science and data needed to make the right decisions concerning moratoriums and expanded restrictions.
