My husband and I backpacked quite a lot in the Upper Buffalo Wilderness when my children were younger, and we got to experience firsthand the natural beauty of the Buffalo National River. We were amazed that Arkansas had the foresight to protect such a gem in order that our future grandchildren could also enjoy the wonders of the Buffalo.

It was wrong for the hog farm permit to have been issued to C&H, in the first place. If you've ever spent a rainy weekend hiking in the area of the Buffalo, you will see firsthand that runoff water seeps and flows from every nook and cranny surrounding the river and quickly finds it way into the river; hence, protecting the watershed areas around the River is vital to protecting the River itself.
