The Regulation is modified to incorporate changes from EPA in the Class V program and affects motor vehicle waste disposal wells and large capacity cesspools, which are defined as Class V wells. The changes to the Regulation will primarily affect business owner/operators such as gas stations, oil change/lube facilities and vehicular repair services that use septic systems or similar methods for waste disposal. These facilities handle fluids that may contain contaminants which pose a threat to human health and the environment. Estimated, potential costs to small business owners/operators may include closure, site remediation and permitting.
